RU MAKING FINANCIAL AID CHANGES?



You should ONLY submit a Change of Information if you want to:

- **reduce** or **decline** your federal **loans**
- update your **enrollment** or **housing** information
- **decline** your **work-study** award
- If you don't have any changes to make there's no need to submit a change of information form

Making Information Changes:

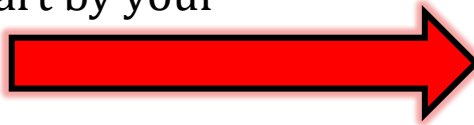

RU MAKING SAP?

Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) is a requirement for all students receiving federal, state, or university assistance while enrolled at Rutgers.

Pay Online By Electronic Check

You may pay by e-check, which is an electronic withdrawal from your checking or savings bank account. No additional fee is charged for the e-check, unless the electronic payment is returned as unpaid from the bank, a \$60.00 returned payment fee is assessed. The \$60 fee consists of a \$50 administrative fee and a \$10 returned check charge assessed by our payment processor when a payment fails.
